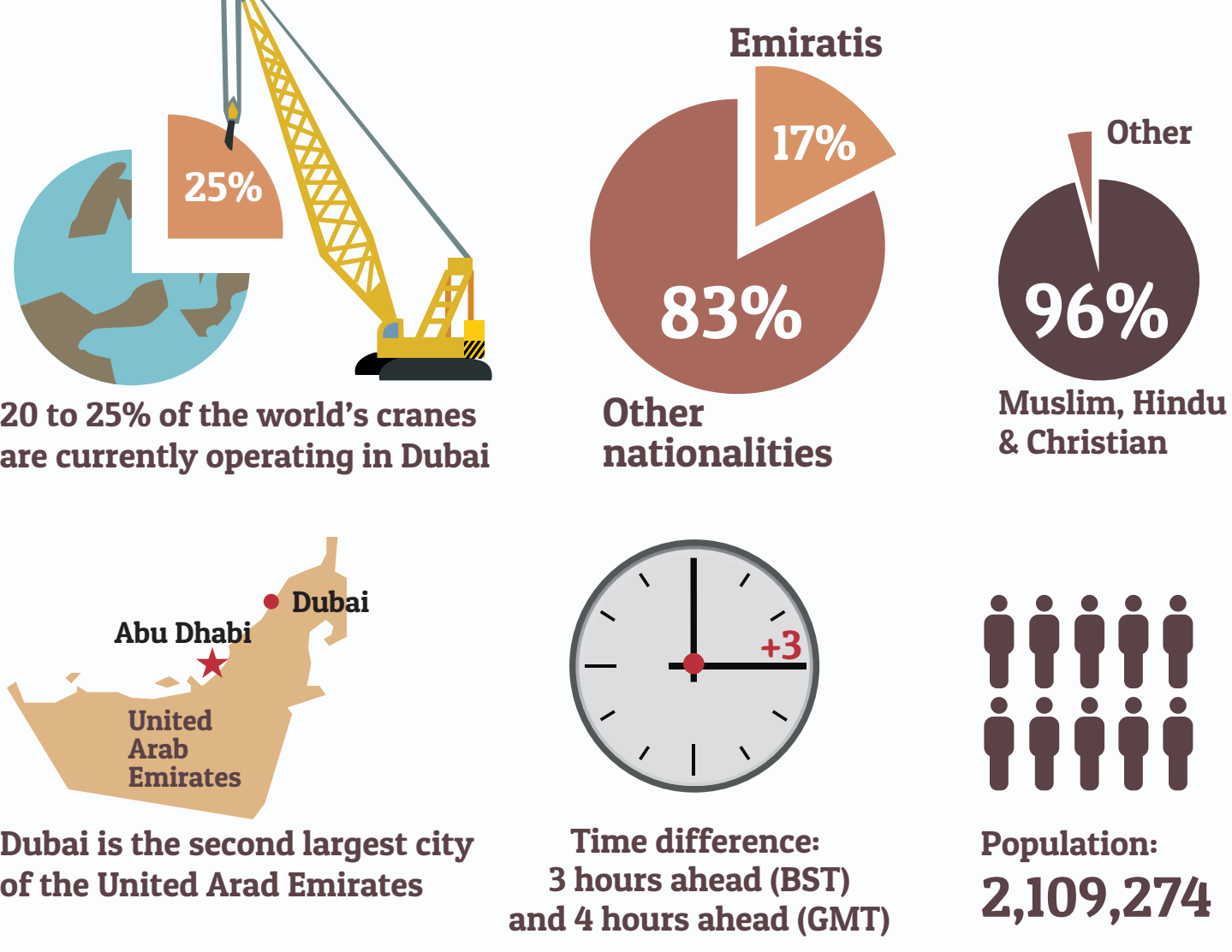

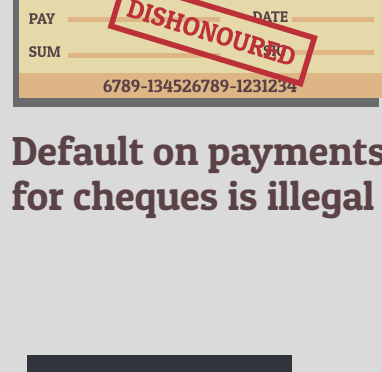

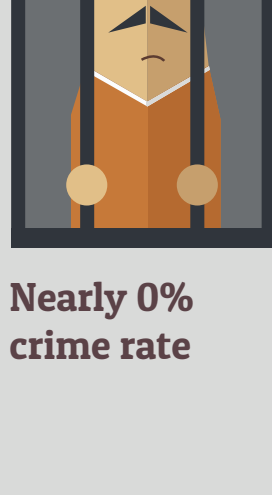
GENERAL INFORMATION

FAMILY

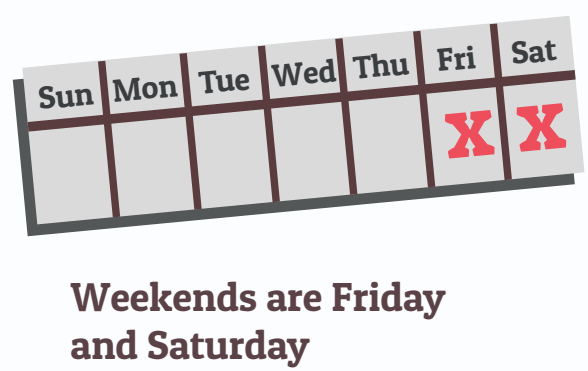


Unwed couples cannot cohabit

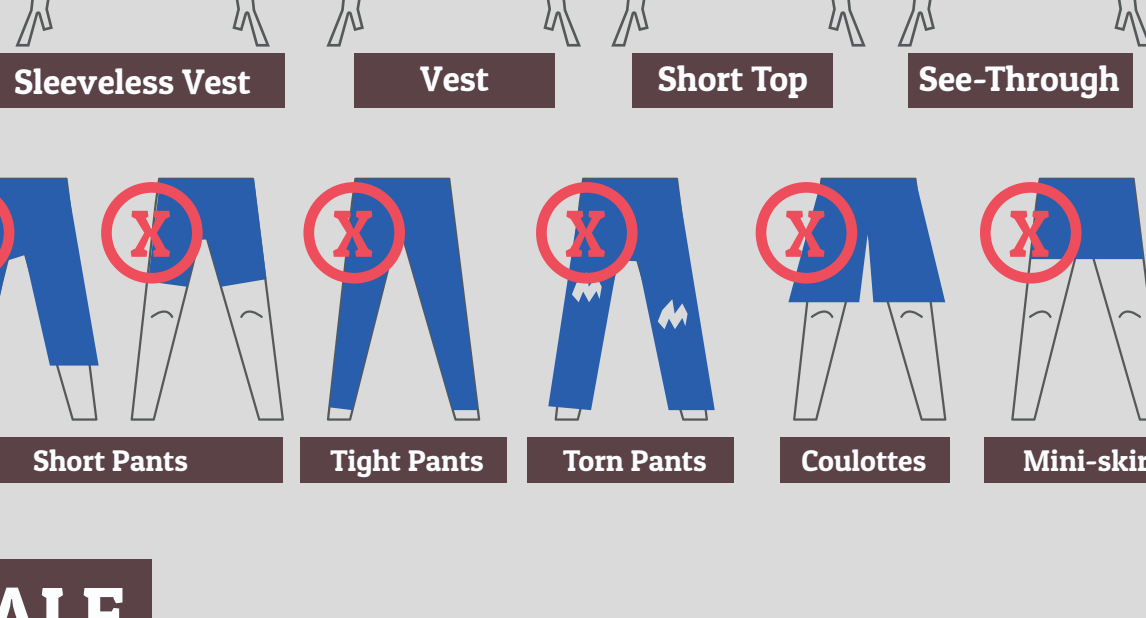
Weekends are Friday and Saturday

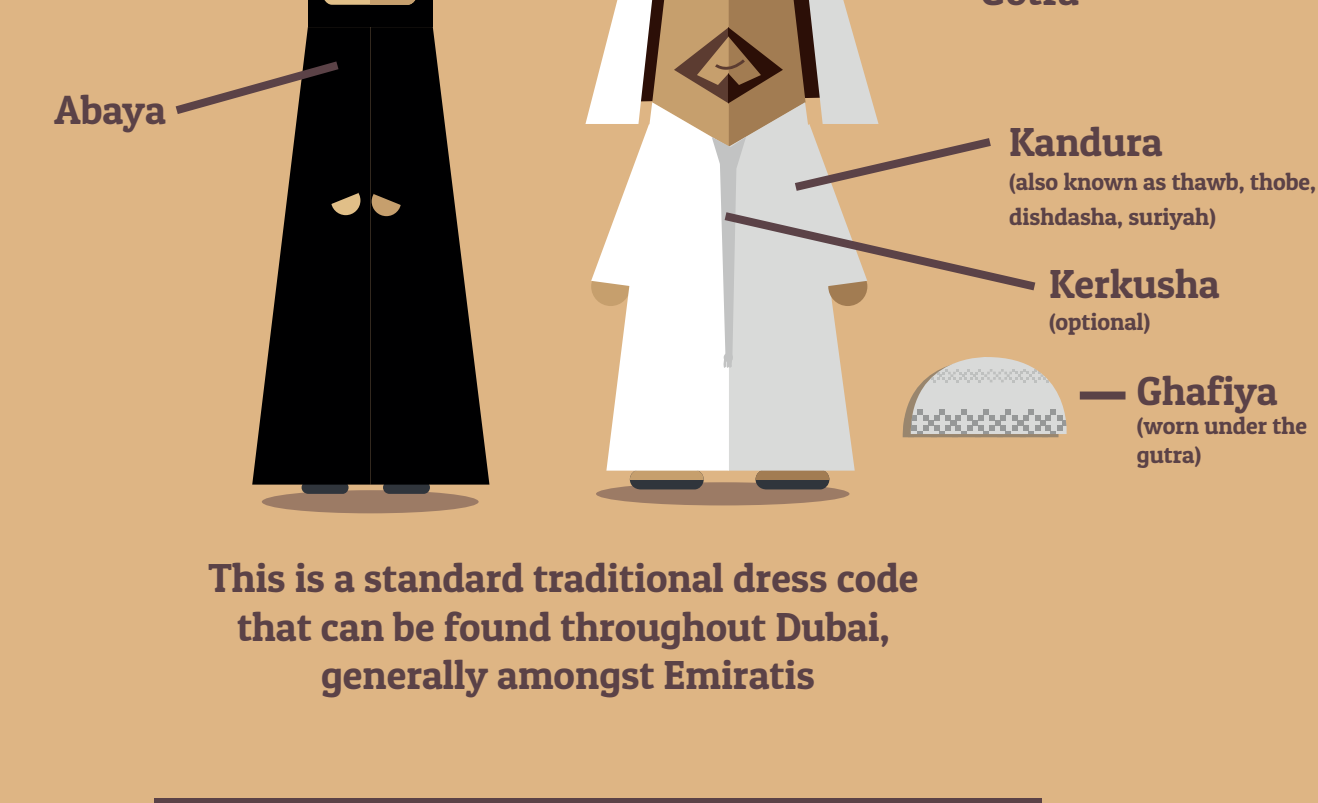

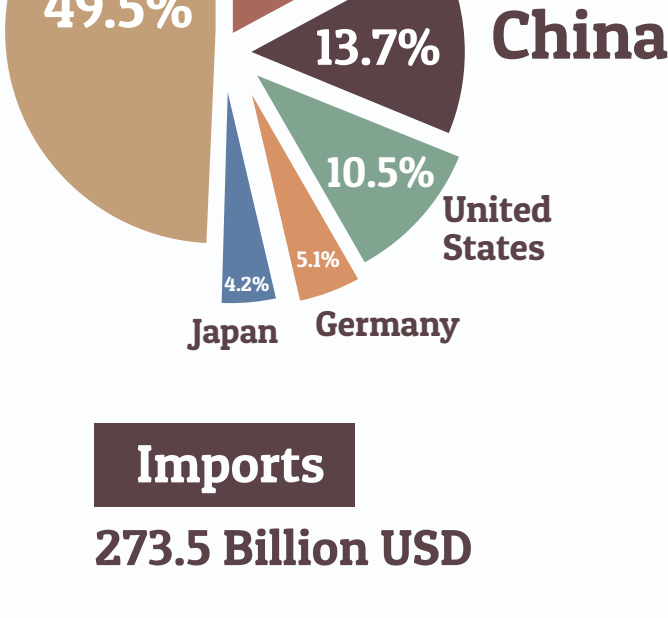
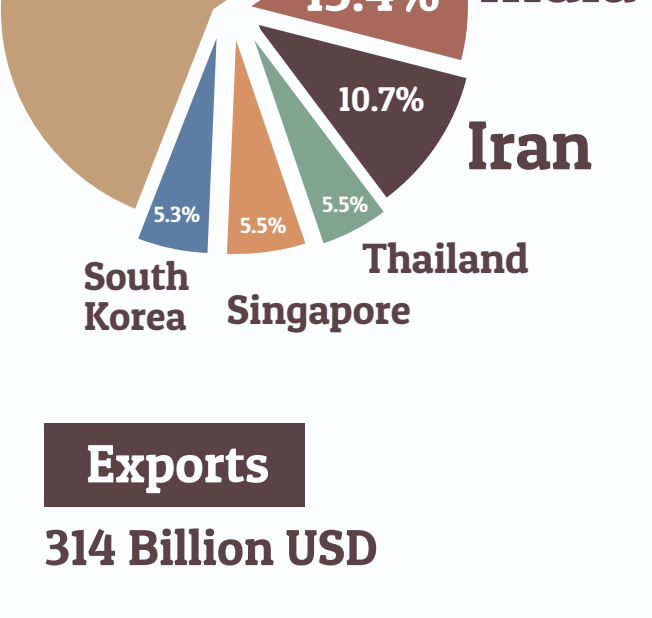
