Importation of used Personal Effects for Expatriates	<ul> <li>Effects under exemption:</li> <li>Original Valid Passport, OBL, AWB.</li> <li>Original 2 years entry permit, (work permit).</li> <li>Personal Pin certificate.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>The goods must have been owned for more than 1 year and must be imported within 90 days after approval of the permit for the shipper.</li> <li>All cosmetics, toiletries, perfumes, alcohol, foodstuffs will be subjected to Radio Active analysis which will cost euros 30 per sample per item. Then dutiable (100%).</li> <li>All shipments will be 100% inspected by Customs.</li> <li>A small air shipment (150 kg) of used personals effects can be imported without duties – ONLY IF THE CLIENT HAS A "3 MONTHS SPECIAL PASS/ TEMPORARY WORK PERMIT".</li> </ul>	
Importation of Personal Effects duty free for Diplomats	<ul> <li>Original Valid Passport, OBL; AWB.</li> <li>Pro1b exemption form approved by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs.</li> <li>Pin certificate.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Takes 2/3 weeks consignee to request with OBL/AWB/packing list + copy of passport.</li> <li>Diplomatic goods are not subject to inspection if there is an approved pro1b.</li> <li>For diplomats, alcohol is not dutiable. Diplomats have to prepare a separate list outlining quantity and brand and submit to their embassy to seek exemption (PRO1A).</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>For air shipment, prior release can be done on collection of copy of pro 1b request+ passport. Check process and cost with your local agent.</li> </ul>
Removal of Goods – Non Diplomats		<ul> <li>New items will be subject to duties taxes and penalties.</li> <li>COC will also be required for any new item.</li> <li>Food, beverage and cosmetics, chemicals cannot be imported duty-free and will be</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Due to short free period given at the port and airport, there is most of the time storage &amp; demurrage (and related charges).</li> <li>Clearance at the airport is 2/3 days and at the Mombasa port 6/10 days.</li> </ul>

Motor Vehicle - Expatriates	<ul> <li>Original valid Passport, OBL, AWB.</li> <li>Original Approved 2 years work-permit.</li> <li>Personal PIN certificate.</li> <li>Original certificate of registration/ logbook of the vehicle, in English.</li> <li>Certificate of roadworthiness must be provided by the owner of the vehicle to the Kenya Bureau of Standards.</li> <li>K.B.S agent (JEVIC) to do the preinspection at origin to obtain the COC for cars coming from Japan/Dubai/Singapore/South Africa/UK or a penalty of 15% of the CIF value will be charged.</li> <li>Other origins can be inspected in Kenya by KBS for a fee of Euros 150.</li> <li>The Bill of Lading and AWB must show car/motor cycle details i.e. chassis and engine numbers, colour, and year of manufacture.</li> <li>If the importer is to pay duty then the following documents are required:</li> <li>Import Declaration Form (IDF),</li> <li>Invoice of purchase,</li> <li>Translation of Invoice if not in English.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Customs registration depends on value of the vehicle.</li> <li>Cars or motorbikes should be registered before release out from the port.</li> <li>The importer must have owned AND USED the vehicle for at least 1 year before the date of shipping for duty free.</li> <li>The vehicle must not be less than 8 years.</li> <li>No left hand drive vehicle allowed into Kenya.</li> <li>Due to registration process which commences after normal clearance, port storage and demurrage are inevitable.</li> </ul>	
Motor vehicles - Diplomats	<ul> <li>Original Valid Passport, OBL, AWB.</li> <li>Pro1b form approved by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs.</li> <li>Original certificate of registration/ logbook of the vehicle, in English.</li> <li>Importer's PIN certificate.</li> <li>Certificate of roadworthiness must be provided by the owner of the vehicle to the</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>The Bill of Lading and AWB must show car/motor cycle details i.e. chassis and engine numbers.</li> <li>Other origin can be inspected in Kenya by KBS for a fee of euros 150.</li> <li>Customs will charge euros 120 for Processing Fee.</li> <li>Diplomats are allowed to import 1</li> </ul>

Motor Vehicles - Returning Residents	<ul> <li>Original and valid passport, same than used personals effects + OBL, AWB.</li> <li>PIN certificate.</li> <li>Original certificate of registration / logbook for the vehicle, in English.</li> <li>Certificate of roadworthiness must be provided by the owner of the vehicle as required by the Kenya Bureau of Standards.</li> <li>KEBS agent (JEVIC/QISJ) to do the preinspection at origin to obtain the COC for cars coming from Japan/ Dubai/Singapore/ South Africa/ UK or a penalty of 15% of the CIF value will be charged by the KBS.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Other originals can be inspected in Kenya by KBS for a fee of euros 150.</li> <li>Customs will charge euros 120 for processing.</li> <li>The Bill of Lading and AWB must show car/motor cycle details i.e. chassis and engine numbers.</li> <li>For all shipments, OBL/AWB/packing list is needed.</li> <li>All wooden crates needs (ISPM) No. 15 requirements.</li> <li>A guarantee deposit can be requested by customs of the value of the duties waiting for the confirmation of exemption and he/she must not have visited Kenya for more than 90 days in the last 2 years prior to his last date of arrival in the Kenya.</li> <li>He must import within 90 days of the last date of arrival.</li> <li>Only one duty free car per returning resident in a lifetime.</li> <li>Cars or motorbikes should be registered before releasing out from the port.</li> <li>The importer must have owned the vehicle for at least 1 year before the date of shipping.
